Covering the Basics. Whatever discipline you ' re working in, you ' ll definitely need to include the following in your academic bio: full name, position (i.e. PhD student; PhD candidate), institution. All this should go into the first sentence, so it reads something like this:

These documents are typically between 1,500 and 3,000 words in length. Your PhD research proposal must passionately articulate what you want to research and why, convey your understanding of existing literature, and clearly define at least one original question and your approach to answering it.
